

In December we broke ground on the long-awaited Crows' Feat Farm store & kitchen, located at 180 Drinkwater Rd (aka Crows' East). The space will provide a place to sell our produce over an extended schedule of days and times – no more shivering in the cold, melting in the rain, or wilting in the heat! We will also be able to process our fruits and vegetables, while offering kitchen and cold storage space to other farmers who need it. Most importantly, we will have an area in which we can meet indoors during the winter months, and continue our community outreach.



At the moment, we're staring at a big hole in the ground! But we have trust in Bob Lang, an experienced local builder who is putting his men to work on behalf of Crows' Feat Farm. We'll be using pine cut and milled here at the farm to side the building – and doing many other things to maintain the local character of this modest structure. With any luck we'll open our doors before year end!

On the first Saturday of every month, we gather as a community to perform the work of this farm that none of us can do alone. In September and November, we got co-op member Ken Couture's hoop house up. We also canned many crates of tomatoes and put our gardens to "bed" for the winter. In December we cleared walking trails through the woods, for the enjoyment of our community, and in January gathered seaweed to nourish the soil. Come join us for fun, food and friendship!
